Legislative Committee Report By Georgia Sharpe, Legislative Co-Chair

The time is nearing for the 2022 elections. Before going to the ballot box, it is crucial that each voter research and explore each candidate and issue so that he/she is informed. MARSP members have the benefit of an advocate that spends time doing this research in the MARSP Legislative Committee. This group of MARSP members and grassroots volunteers spend time presenting, discussing, debating and reaching agreement on issues that impact MARSP's mission to protect the pensions and healthcare benefits of public school retirees. You can find a report of the bills MARSP is watching, supporting, or opposing at marsp.org/advocacy.

When needed, legislators are contacted and lobbied regarding bills introduced. One way we can work together to contact legislators is through OneClickPolitics, MARSP's new online advocacy program. If you are interested in joining MARSP's legislative ambassadors or learning more about OneClickPolitics, inquire with your chapter president. Training opportunities will also be available in the future.

On May 24, MARSP held a Legislative Outreach Day in Lansing at Karoub Associates, Michigan's longest-serving multi-client lobbying firm. Karoub serves as MARSP's legislative lobbyist. Ambassadors spent the day discussing MARSP's key legislative concerns during individual appointments with Senators and Representatives. This year, we focused on

relief from pension taxes. This issue is now in committee and has multiple variations presented in legislature. MARSP provided discussion bullet points for the ambassadors to use. There was also a lunch held that day to meet with legislators in a more informal manner. The time is enjoyed by all attending and is a productive way to make our voice heard in hopes of persuading legislators. We will be planning another Outreach Day later this year.

MARSP is committed to being the premier advocate for all retired public school personnel. We make sure that our 30,000+ members' voices and views are heard in Lansing. MARSP is your lobbying partner on critical issues impacting retirees and an authority on the MPSERS pension and healthcare system. MARSP will help you explore the issues closest to you so that you can make informed decisions.

Executive Director's Message By Royce C. Humm, MARSP Executive Director staff@marsp.org

At MARSP, we often say *"there's strength in numbers."* During these days of budget negotiations, and on the cusp of another election season, the phrase couldn't be truer.

As I write, the Legislature is getting ready to pass the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 state budget after weeks of negotiations. The framework of the budget agreement likely won't include pension tax relief at this time, but we expect to see supplemental bills addressing the remainder of the budget, as well as tax relief, in the coming months. While we'd hoped for earlier resolution, this gives MARSP more time to reach out to elected officials and make our voices heard.

MARSP and the Legislative Committee and Ambassadors are on the ground at the state capitol, meeting with policymakers and urging action to repeal or reduce the tax on retirement income. On May 24, 2022, MARSP Legislative Ambassadors gathered in Lansing for a Legislative Outreach Day. Between the Senate and House sessions, ambassadors met with legislators from their district to discuss MARSP's four key legislative concerns:

- Retirement income tax exemption
- Alleviating school personnel shortages by allowing retirees back into districts
- Completing the state budget by June 30
- Solvency of the pension fund

Help amplify our efforts in Lansing by sending the letters on the following page to your Senator and Representative. You can use these pre-written letters and/or send your own letter of experience and expectations when it comes to tax repeal.

Every individual step by every individual member shows our elected officials that there's a solid community of public school retirees behind the name *MARSP***.** When each of us plays a small part, our words and actions carry greater weight in Lansing.



Don't be afraid to get creative, too! Sue Jakubiak, MARSP President-elect, made candy bars to bring to her appointments with legislators, wrapped in the key legislative concerns above. Her idea has already prompted other MARSP

individuals and groups to reach out in a similar, sweet fashion.

A GRAND ADVENTURE: Catching Up with MARSP's 2020 Grand Hotel Trip Winner

We recently spoke with Bonnie Lawrence, MARSP Member and winner of the 2020 MARSP Referral Grand Hotel Prize Trip. Bonnie was finally able to visit Mackinac Island in September 2021, accompanied by her friend, Carol.

Bonnie Lawrence devoted her professional life to Special Education and Early Childhood Development, eventually earning a double masters in the field from Oakland University. At the start of her career, the need for special education teachers was so great that the Lapeer County school district hired her as a Head Start teacher directly after student teaching. She continued to teach for another 12 years and then transitioned into Special Education Director in Lapeer to lead the Pre-Kindergarten Special Needs Program. Bonnie excelled in this position for the next 18 years.

In 2010, just before her 60th birthday, Bonnie lost her husband of 37 years to cancer. That same year, she was offered a buyout from the district. While she loved her work, Bonnie knew, too, that leaving would open up her world to new opportunities.

She found her next adventure while talking with a niece who was preparing for a tour with the Peace Corp after college graduation. Bonnie applied for the Peace Corps in July 2011, and left on her mission in October of 2012. She spent the next two years teaching in Lesotho, a small country in southern Africa. Of the 30 people

that were on her mission, only five were seniors – one of them was Carol. Bonnie and Carol became fast friends and the two continued to travel and enjoy life together after their mission.

Carol lives with her family in St. Louis, and had been to Michigan, but never further north

than Grand Rapids. When Bonnie found out she had won a trip to the Grand Hotel on Mackinac Island, she knew Carol was the friend to accompany her. The two turned the trip into a week-long tour of Northern Michigan and the Upper Peninsula.

Having been to the island many times, Bonnie knew all the tips and tricks, like parking in St. Ignace vs Mackinaw City to travel across to the island. She noted that on a normal day, you can see Mackinac Island from the shores of St. Ignace, but the two found themselves in the middle of a September storm.

They got a buggy and toured the island, sampling fudge from every shop on the main street and awarding "Best Fudge" to The Murray Hotel. 

2022 MARSP SCHOLARSHIP FUND WINNERS




