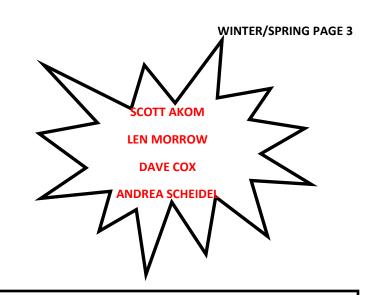

## **OCTOBER 19 MEETING W/ SUPERINTENDENTS**

Our October membership meeting was held at the Career Tech Center in Cadillac. Our program focused on current educational needs of local school districts including finances, Covid monies, and the mental state of students and staff. Our panel included Scott Akom. McBain Superintendent, Len Morrow, Manton Superintendent, Dave Cox, Superintendent of Wexford/Missaukee and Manistee ISDs, and Andrea Scheidel, Special Education, Assistant Superintendent.

The Superintendents discussed General Education funding from the state of Michigan. Funding remains positive from the State. Additional funds from Covid relief have been utilized in local districts to support mental health concerns for students. Monies have been used to provide additional staff including counselors and social workers. The problem for local districts remains in the areas of staff recruitment and retention. Some waivers for staff certification have been granted to help with general education. Special Education teacher certification is still the one area that has not been allowed to make accommodations for teacher certification, creating numerous vacancies in areas of Special Education.,

Student test scores are lower than pre-Covid levels. Support interventions have been used to help fill in the gaps. State testing continues to be one area of concern in all facets of education. Teacher evaluation also continues to be tied directly to student class-room performances.

The general consensus from our panel discussions was also focused around retention of educators due to lack of respect and appreciation of all educational staff. Competitive teaching salaries based on where you live in the state continue to plague rural areas in recruitment of staff.
