SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE NEWS

Greetings, Macomb North MARSP Chapter Members! I hope that you have enjoyed a healthy and reasonably contented summer season, and that you're ready for autumn to arrive. "Who is ever ready for THAT?" you may be asking, but the season will change, ready or not, so...we may as well get the flannel sheets and shirts organized, and figure out the winter tire situation early rather than late, y'know??

Just to refresh your memories, our scholarship committee awarded just one \$500 scholarship in June, with our decision being announced at the meeting held at The Voyageur in St. Clair.

Our 2024 scholarship recipient is Emma Hanson, who is Sue Harris's granddaughter. Emma attended Eisenhower High School in Utica, and she graduated in 2021. Emma began college-level work at Macomb Community College, earning a 3.7 GPA and Dean's List honor. She transferred to Pensacola State College in Florida, continuing her scholastic efforts in General Studies and earning an Associates' degree last spring. Now Emma is working in PSC's Nursing program, with the goal of graduating in 2025. In her "free" time, Emma Hanson works at McDonald's, studies piano, and is respected for her strong work ethic, which, along with striving for academic excellence, as always, has resulted in a 3.5 GPA. We are very happy to have awarded Emma a \$500 scholarship!

You may be asking why we only awarded one scholarship this time. Well, it seems that, this year, we only received one scholarship application. Fortunately, that "app" was from an excellent student, a young woman whose paperwork was all there, and whose recommendations and transcripts, three of the criteria which we always consider, gave evidence of a person deserving of any help which we could give. Of course, we had questions about why only one set of forms had shown-up in my mailbox.

As a result of discussions committee members and leaders have had, we <u>are</u> going to institute some changes in the number of awards, the amount of the awards, and whether to use technology to, for example, send applications via the Internet. These thoughts were shared with members of Chapter Leadership, and it was at the meeting on August 15 that the following <u>proposals</u> were decided upon:

- 1) award three scholarships only;
- 2) raise the amount of each scholarship to \$1000; and
- 3)send scholarship forms to applicants via e-mail.

These proposals will be acted upon at our September meeting, so if you would like to have a chance to join the discussion about them, as well as get the opportunity to vote on them, please attend the meeting on Tuesday, September 10, 2024 at the Aspen Restaurant on Hall Road, just west of Heydenreich Road.
